Mr. Hari Prasad was born on 16th November 1982 at Hunsur, Mysore. At the age of 13 years he was started playing hockey game seriously. The hockey game, his parents and friends are inspiration to him to take up this sport and they also supported and co-operated him to hockey game.

His parents wanted me to be a sportsman because he was interested in sports from his childhood days and feels that it was easy to get jobs. He spent the most of his childhood days in Hunsur and adulthood days in the Bangalore city that allowed him to get better facilities to play and practice hockey game in his early days.

Family:

Hari Prasad's father Mr. G.K Mallapa was a former and mother Mrs. B. B. Shashikala she was a clerical staff (coffee caring works) and he had one younger brother.

Education:

Mr. Hari Prasad was completed his school days at St. Joseph Indian high school, Bangalore in the year 1998 and 12th class (PUC) studied at Al Ameen College, Bangalore and subsequently completed the same in the year 2000. Further he joined for the Bachelor of Arts (B.A) degree course at Al Ameen Degree College, Bangalore and graduated in the year 2003. Further he studied P.G. Diploma in Human Resource Management (HRM) at Jain College, Bangalore and completed the same in the year 2006.

Hockey Career and Achievements:

He got the hockey basics training at the age of 13 and advance training at the age of 16 at Bangalore. He

used to practice hockey game daily morning 2 hours and evening 2 hours and he used to do physical fitness, steep work, skills drills and gym training before the main tournaments. He was in the school sports hostel from 1996 to 1999 and he was mainly the product of SAI Sports Hostel, Bangalore and there he was got training from the year 2002 to 2007. Further he was elevated from SAI, Bangalore to Centre of Excellence and there he got advanced training from 2001 to 2005. He got to see lot of video sessions, got special diet, did gym sessions, utilizing latest equipments like shoes, hockey sticks, technical training to acclimatize to different weather conditions etc. before the international competitions.

Hari Prasad was another star to emerge from the stable of South's Sansarpur, Coorg, Gowdalli Mallappa Hariprasad had a chequrred career since made his first outing in 2003 (Akber El Yom Cup, Cairo).

Though he made his senior debut in the Azlan Shah Cup next year, missed Olympics but bounced back soon for all senior engagements post Athens. With 21 senior caps, was one of experienced colts at India's 2005 Junior World Cup campaign. But he was not considered for any senior assignment in 2005, made a name for himself by scoring peach of goal in the third final of the second PHL at Chandigarh. Posted the winning goal against the Kiwis in 2006 Azlan Shah Cup bronze medal play off.

After a brief stint at Customs, joined India Airlines in 2005 and now plays for Bangalore Lions in PHL and scored the winning goal in his team winning the 2006 PHL title. Unfortunately, could not find a place in the national team after Doha Asian Games.

He was had a very bad experience during Junior World Cup 2006 semi-final match held at Holland, Asian Games 2006 (lost) held at Doha, China and Asia Cup 2009 held at Malaysia respectively where he narrowly lost of getting the medals. As he was dropped from the Indian hockey team from World Cup, Asian Games and Commonwealth Games in the year 2010 his performance was really went down.

His last International appearance was at 2010 France Test Series. He was represented in the 75 national/international matches and scored 40 goals to his credit.
