Early Days:

Mr. Shanmugham Pandurangan was born on 3rd May, 1974 in Bangalore and was an Indian hockey player. He started playing hockey game seriously when he was at the age of 10 years.

The hockey game and his parents are inspiration to him to take of this sport and they also supported and co-operated to him. He spent the most of his childhood and adulthood days in the Bangalore city that allowed him to get better facilities to play and practice hockey game in his early days.

He got basic training in the hockey game from the year 1984 and advance training from the year 1990. In the year 1995, 1996, and 1997 he participated in the State level school hockey tournaments and secured 2nd and first positions respectively. Further he participated in the State level college hockey tournaments and secured first position (winner).

In his early days he played at NSTC, Bangalore (1997), SAI, Bangalore (1997-98) and Centre of Excellence 1998-2001 with better facilities and he groomed their as a professional hockey player. At the age of 10 he got the basic training in the beginning and at the age of 17 he got advance training.

He got the special physical fitness training from Mr. Saju Joseph, Physical fitness trainer at SAI, Bangalore before the national and international tournaments. He used to practice hockey game daily morning 3 hours and evening 3 hours.

Family:

His father Mr. M. Pandurangan was a sportsman and he was retired HMT employee, Bangalore and mother Mrs. Kokila Pandurangan, she was house wife. He had one elder brother. He got married to Kirupa Rani in the year 2004 and had one male child namely Manivik Shanmugham.

Education Career:

Mr. Shanmugham Pandurangan studied at Bangalore and completed his 10th class in the year 1989 with distinction (74%) and continued his studies and completed his 12th class (PUC) in the year 1992.

Further he joined for B.E Mechanical degree at B.M.S Engineering College, Bangalore and in the year 2012 he was the member of social entrepreneurship outlook programme 12th batch conducted by the Centre for Social Initiative and Management, Bangalore.

He was admitted to M.B.A (Sports Management) course in the Tamilnadu Physical Education and Sports University, Chennai but he discontinued it.

Hockey Career and Achievements:

Mr. Shanmugham Pandurangan was a very talented hockey player at junior level. In the year 1991 he felt that he can able to participate at the national and international hockey tournaments and before the competition he used to do lot physical fitness and game preparation. In the year 1992 he represented Karnataka State Junior hockey team as a Captain at Imphal, Manipur and in the same year he represented Karnataka State Senior hockey team in the South-Zone hockey championship held at Tirupathi.

He represented Bangalore University hockey team in the South Zone hockey tournament 1992 and secured first (winner) place. Then he represented Karnataka State Junior hockey team in the Junior National hockey tournament 1993 held at Rai Bareily and secured first (winner) place and further in the same year he underwent in the Indian Junior South-Zone coaching camp held at Gwalior in the year 1993.

In the year 1994 he represented Karnataka State Junior hockey team in the South-Zone Junior hockey championship 1994 held at Nellore, Andhra Pradesh and secured first (winner) place and further in the same year he underwent in the Indian Junior South-Zone coaching camp held at New Delhi in the year 1994.

He represented Karnataka State Senior hockey team in the South-Zone Senior hockey championship 1996 held at Dharmavaram, Andhra Pradesh and secured first (winner) place and further in the same year he deprived of getting medals in the Senior National Hockey Tournament held at Bangalore.

In the year 1997 he represented Karnataka State Senior hockey team in the South-Zone Senior hockey championship (3rd place) held at Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh, 58th Senior National Hockey Championship (quarter final) held at Bangalore, 4th National Games held at Bangalore, Federation Cup, at Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh respectively.

In the year 1999 he represented Karnataka State Senior hockey team as a captain in the Southern State Games held at Bangalore (first place) and National Hockey Tournament, held at Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh respectively. In the year 2000 he represented in the Karnataka State Senior hockey team 60th Senior Nationals and in the year 2001 he represented in the National Games and secured 2nd place.

He got special training in the Indian camps before international competition and he also undergone training outside India in the Germany and Frankfurt under the international coach Mr. Volker Knap.

He was the stand-bye player for the Commonwealth Games 1998 held at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and also represented Indian Hockey Team in the India v/s Pakistan test series 1999. Besides the above he had played in Germany for Eintracht Hockey Club, Frankfurt in the Second Division Hockey League (1999) under former German National player and Malaysian National Coach.

His thoughts:

Important factors that influence over my achievements are that I treated hockey game and sport as a subject and that helped me to learn every day.
