He joined the Centre of Excellence in 1998 and a year later played his first Senior Nationals at Hyderabad, and was picked among the 72 probable's for a conditioning camp. He played his first Senior Nationals held at Hyderabad in the year 1999 and in the same year he made his junior debut in the European tour under the coaches CR Kumar and Harendera.

He scored eight goals in the Junior Asia Cup 2000 and he also scored vital goals at the Junior World Cup before earning senior spurs under the coach Fedric D Souza regime as a pact of title winning team in the Prime Minister Gold Cup 2001 held at Dhaka, Bangladesh that was his international debut for the Indian men's national hockey team since then he cemented his place in the senior side.

Halappa represented India at the 2004 Summer Olympics, where India finished in seventh place. He represented India at the 2010 Commonwealth Games in New Delhi, where India finished in second place.

Arjun Halappa was an accomplished all-rounder and matured later to become a pivot which he excels nowadays and a good stopper in penalty corner drills. His inspiration as a young player was Jude Felix and he admires him as a person, player and coach. He was also grateful to his parents and wife for their constant support.
